Ellie and Jonas learn about fire

The educational material consists of a pupil booklet and a guide for the person using the material. The guide also contains in-depth fact sections coupled to the corresponding sections in the material.

The booklet is structured like a story. Each section includes pictures that the children can colour in.

The material aims to provide children with basic knowledge about fire. The aim is for children to get out quickly and stay out if there is a fire. They will also learn to be around fire and not to play with it.

The material also teaches children how to call the emergency number 112.

Age group 6–10 years old

The educational material consists of a pupil booklet and a guide for the person using the material. The guide also contains an in-depth fact section. The various sections alternate short texts with exercises. The material is suitable for work in groups as well as alone.

The material aims to provide children with basic knowledge about fire. The aim of the material is that children should have an understanding of how easily fires can develop and what to do if a fire starts. Pupils will also learn about the local fire and rescue service and how to call the emergency number 112.

Age group 9–13 years old



An accident happens so easily

The educational material consists of a pupil booklet and a guide for the person using the material. The guide also contains an in-depth fact section. The various sections alternate short texts with exercises. The material is suitable for work as groups as well as alone.

The material aims to provide children with basic knowledge about fire. It also aims to create a greater awareness and attention in children about other risks and hazards in their daily lives, such as hazardous substances in the home, ice and water, and also and how to call the emergency number 112. The material also addresses the problem of arson.

The material is only available in Swedish.



Web-based Information Security Training

ISA is an online interactive training course on information security that is primarily aimed at pupils in grades 4 and 5 (10–11 years old). As children and adolescents handle a lot of information, and mostly digitally, the aim of the ISA is to increase the awareness of secure information handling and behavior.

The course is divided into six sections, each section including a film, some scenarios and a teacher's guide. ISA is free, requires no prior knowledge and is easily accessible via the MSB's website. ISA is only available in Swedish.

ISA provides teacher support in its efforts to meet the objectives of secure information handling in accordance with the curricula.

Are you aware?

This PDF material is divided into stand-alone chapters, which can be downloaded. Besides pupil material, there is a teacher's guide with tips on discussion questions and exercises and a separate in-depth fact section. The various chapters cover fire theory, arson, prevention and reacting in the event of fire, the emergency number 112, hazardous substances, dangerous goods, fireworks, defence, emergency preparedness, natural disasters, the emergency services, security policy, everyday accidents, water and ice safety and the Important Public Announcement (VMA).

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BLACKOUT

Blackout

Blackout is a role-play scenario about society's and the individual's preparedness for a prolonged power cut or blackout. Students from varying family circumstances have to deal with the crisis to satisfy the need for food, water and warmth. The role-play allows students to also think about what decisions must be made for the municipality to be able to take responsibility for its activities even though the community is exposed to severe strain.

A trained role-play leader comes to the classroom and implements Blackout. To get as much as possible out of the role-play there is a simple teacher's guide that can be used before and after the role-play.

The game is designed for both the 12–16 and the 16–19 age groups.

The website addresses issues related to our common security. The site deals with the subject of threats and risks - to societal security and to peace in the world - and the systems that are in place to prevent wars and crises. This website includes information on how the Swedish civil protection and emergency preparedness systems work and how our Swedish total defence system is structured, as well as descriptions about Swedish civil and military operations around the world including the background to over forty current conflicts.

The material consists, among other things, of factual articles, news reports and interviews. There is also a separate section for teachers.

A digital knowledge quiz, Ice Storm, is available on www.sakerhetspolitik.se. With this quiz students can test their knowledge regarding societal preparedness and their own preparedness in the event that Sweden is hit by a crisis.
