Is Sweden a safe country to live in?

Yes. But serious incidents can occur, such as a major fire or a chemical accident, and it's important that people are able to get information quickly.

What is an Important Public Announcement?

When a serious incident occurs, authorities can send out an Important Public Announcement (VMA) via radio, TV, text messages and the outdoor alarm system Hesa Fredrik. With SE-Alert, a warning alarm is sent directly to your phone.

How do I get the warning alarm?

SE-Alert is sent to smartphones that are located within the affected area. You don't need to download an app. To receive the alarm, the phone must be updated and turned on.

How will I notice the warning alarm?

When an SE-Alert is sent, you receive a message on your phone. The phone vibrates and emits a loud signal for about 10 seconds.

What do I have to do if I receive a warning alarm?

Read the message calmly. It tells you what has happened and what you have to do. The same information can be found on the radio, TV and the internet. Ask for help if anything is unclear.

What happens next?

Follow the instructions in the message. For example, this might be to go indoors, close doors and windows or to stay away from a location. Once you have followed the instructions, you can click to remove the message.
